


These are tough and challenging times.




Stormzy offers scholarships for young black men and women at the University of Cambridge.

He made a pledge to donate £1M annually for 10 years, to charities, organisations and movements which are committed to fighting racial inequality, justice reform and black empowerment within the UK.

He also has a partnership with Penguin Random House, called #MerkyBooks that have published books such as 'Taking up Space: The Black Girl's Manifesto for Change'. Stormzy is openly interested in politics and encourages people to pay attention, educate themselves on what is happening and to vote accordingly. London born, award winning artist and activist.





BARONESS LAWRENCE

Mother of Stephen Lawrence- a black British teen who was murdered in a racist attack in South East London in 1993.

Baroness Lawrence has since gone on to achieve great things. She has promoted reforms on the police service as well as founding her trust. In 2003, she was appointed with an OBE for services to community relations in 2003.

She was selected to sit on panels within the Home Office and Police Service, as well as being a member of both the board and the council of liberty, the human rights organisation. Baroness Lawrence is also a patron for the hate crime charity 'Stop Hate UK'.

She was appointed as Race Relations Advisor to the Labour Party in 2020.








Mr Lammy has experienced racism throughout his life and directly felt police discrimination.

He has led the well known campaign for Windrush British Citizens to be granted British citizenship and he has set up a specialist Commonwealth Taskforce while establishing a compensation scheme for those involved.



Throughout his time in politics he has created the 'Lammy Review' which is an independent review into the treatment of, and outcomes, for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic individuals in the CJS. Mr Lammy actively encourages open spaces to discuss racism and he aims to keep it in the spot-light while actively seeking solutions and educating people around the current issues.

ANNE-MARIE IMAFIDON

Ms Imafidon is a computing, mathematics and languages child prodigy:

- One of the youngest to pass TWO GCSE's while still in Primary School
- At 13, she received a scholarship to study mathematics at university
- At 15 she was admitted in a degree programme with Oxford University
- At 17 she began her master's
- At 19 she became the youngest masters graduate

At the age of 10, she could speak 6 different languages.

She speaks up about black lives and runs a webinar called "Black Lives Matter: From Awareness to Action". She aims to inspire and empower women in STEM careers and received an MBE for her work in this sector and with STEM communities.

KSI is ranked the second most influential online creator in the UK by The Times.



Diane Abbott is the longest-serving black MP in the House of Commons, after being elected in 1987.

She has founded the 'London Schools and the Black Child programme', which aims to help black children achieve in the classroom.

She is also a Race Relations Officer at the National Council for Civil Liberties.

Ms Abbott has faced disproportionate sexism and racism as a public figure, individually receiving almost half of all abusive tweets directed at women MPs during the 2017 election campaign.

She consistently voted against several policies such as launching the Iraq war and the continued support for Saudi Arabian-led military intervention in Yemen.




ANTHONY JOSHUA

As of April 2020, he is ranked as the World's second-best active heavyweight boxer by The Ring Magazine.


He is a two-time unified heavyweight champion, having held the WBA, IBF, WBO, and IBO titles.



He has attended, and spoken out at, Black Lives Matter protests. His speeches are based on his lived experiences and his personal feelings. A line was taken from his speech and used for 'farright' propaganda, accusing Anthony of being racist himself. Whist an upsetting experience, it has brought wider attention to the subject pf racism and education.

Ismail Ahmed was a refugee in England when he began to pick strawberries and do summer jobs before going on to work for the UN development programme.

While there he discovered corruption and whistle-blew, which resulted in him losing his position within the programme. Later he was given £200,000 for unfair dismissal.

With this money he decided to attend London Business school and went on to invest his money into his business which launched in 2010. His business is so successful that he has successfully created 600 jobs and he handles 1.1 million payments per month. In 2019 he was named first in the 'Powerlist'.
